Mrs. Tena Ammann, 64, Dies Thursday After Short Illness Stroke Suffered July 28 is Cause of Death of Local Woman

Funeral services for Mrs. Tena Ammann, 64 years of age, resident of Monticello for the past five years, who passed away at 10:35 a.m. Thursday in the St. Clare hospital, Monroe, were held at 2 Saturday afternoon in the Evangelical United Brethren church here.

The Rev. L. A. Brown, church pastor, officiated, and burial was in Greenwood cemetery, Monroe. Pallbearers were Clarence Blumer, Kermit D. Kammerer, Henry Milbrandt, Arthur Miller, Willard Prisk and Dr. R. A. Woodruff.

Mrs. Ammann had been hospitalized since July 29th after she suffered a stroke the day before.

Tena Knipschild was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Adam Knipschild. She attended schools in Monroe. On Feb. 20, 1909, she was united in marriage to John P. Ammann, the ceremony taking place in Monroe. They operated a farm near Juda for 24 years. In 1936 they moved to the former Henry F. Kubly farm, about two miles east of Monticello, where they farmed until moving to the village March 1, 1946.

Mrs. Ammann was a member of the Evangelical United Brethren church.

Surviving are two daughters, Mrs. Willis Kopp, Albany, and Mrs. Jacob Weiland, Beloit; one son, Willard, Monroe: one brother, Edward Knipschild, Milwaukee, and 12 grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her husband July 1, 1946, and one sister, Mrs. Andrew Tschudy, Monroe.
