## **Emil Anderegg**

Jan. 2, 1895 - July 6, 1977

A retired Mt. Pleasant Township farmer, Emil Anderegg, 82, Rt. 1, Monticello, died Wednesday, July 6, in St. Clare Hospital. He entered the hospital on July 4.

His funeral was held on Saturday, July 9, in the Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello, with his pastor Rev. Charles G. Workman officiating. Burial was in Highland Cemetery.
