Mrs. John Baebler, 80, Dies Thursday Of Heart Attack

Funeral services for Mrs. John Baebler, Sr. highly esteemed resident of Monticello for many years, who passed away at 4:40 a. m. Thanksgiving day at the St. Clare hospital, Monroe, were held at 2:30 Sunday afternoon in the Zwingli United Church of Christ here. .

The Rev. A. R. Achtemeier, church pastor, officiated, and burial was in Highland cemetery. Pallbearers were John C. Babler, Henry V. Baebler, Monticello, Fred C. Baebler, Janesville, Clarence W. Freitag, DeKalb, [Ill, Henry F. Kubly, Monroe, and Alfred Rhyner, Brodhead.

Suffered Heart Attack

Mrs. Baebler suffered a heart attack at her home at 3 a. m. Thursday and passed away about 10 minutes after arriving at the hospital.

Anna Rhyner was born in Mt. Pleasant. township Nov. 23, 1877, the daughter of Henry and Elizabeth Norder Rhyner. She attended the Elmer rural school in Mt. Pleasant township. On Jan. 17, 1895, she was united in marriage in Monticello to John Baebler, the Rev. Rusterholtz performing the ceremony. Mr. and Mrs. Baebler farmed in Iowa for six years and moved to Mt. Pleasant township in 1901. They lived on their Mt. Pleasant township farm until 1923, when they moved to the village.

Mr. Baebler served as a patrolman with the highway department for a number of years after retiring from the farm.

Mrs. Baebler was a devoted member of the Zwingli United Church of Christ and its Ladies' Aid Circle.

She is survived by two sons; John H. Baebler and Dr. Wm. V. Baebler, Monticello; one daughter, Mrs. Edward (Elizabeth) Stone, Silver Springs, Md.; five grandchildren, and six great-grandchildren.

The last member of her family, Mrs. Baebler was preceded in death by her husbandS in 1946, three brothers and three sisters.
