Former Bank Employee Dies in Hospital After Extended Illness

Funeral services for Clarence Lee Barlow, 67 years of age, a native of Monticello and for many years a resident of Madison, who passed away at 9 o'clock Friday morning in a Madison hospital after several years of declining health, were held at 2 Monday afternoon in the Fitch-Lawrence funeral home, Madison.

The Rev. Frederick Wolff of the Glenway Moravian church, officiated, and burial was in Forest Lawn cemetery, Madison.

Born in Monticello

Clarence Lee Barlow was a native of Monticello, having been born here Dec. 24, 1880, the son of Joseph and Martha Wallace Barlow. On Sept. 30, 1903, he was united in marriage to Fannie Gerber, also of Monticello. He was employed at the Bank of Monticello from 1900 until 1903. when he became associated with the First National Bank of Monroe, becoming cashier of that bank. He left Monroe in 1925 to become secretary of the old Madison Trust Company.

While in Monroe he was a member of the city school board and of the Green county board. He was active in civic affairs and in the Masonic Order.

The prolonged illness of his wife, who died three years ago, forced his retirement from active business. Ill health followed and his illness struck heavily on Dec, 26, 1947. He was hospitalized and underwent a serious operation from which he never recovered.

Survivors include one daughter, Verena, Madison; two sons, Meredith, Madison, and Frederick, Burbank, Calif.,; three granddaughters; two brothers, Wendell, Monticello, and Reuel, Urbana, Ill,; one sister, Myrtie, Van Port City, Ore.; and a half-sister, Norene Mowry, Vallejo, Calif,
