DEATH NOTICE Of the Late Mrs. George W. Bray, of Adams.

At her home in the town of Adams, Myrtle, wife of Geo. W. Bray, and a daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. S. T. Clayton, departed this life for the life beyond on Saturday, April 20, 1901, the immediate cause of her death being hemorrhage of the lung. She had been in poor health for the past year, and for about two months was confined to her bed.

Deceased was born in the town of Washington Nov. 2, 1872, and was married to Geo. W. Bray Dec. 28, 1893.

She united with the Methodist church in June, 1894, continuing a faithful worker of the class of which her father had been leader for fifteen years.

Every attention that could be bestowed upon her by a loving husband, kind friends and neighbors, was hers. Myrtle is the third sister who has passed to the home beyond in the last three years—all in the month of April.

A husband, three children, aged 6, 4 and 2 years, three brothers and two sisters are left to mourn her loss.
