Leon J. Breylinger, Redlands, Calif., a native of Monticello and cashier of the Bank of Monticello at one time, passed away Oct. 8th after a long illness. Mr. Breylinger was 78 years of age at the time of his death.

The son of Fred J. and Mary Clementine Breylinger, he was born in Monticello Oct. 2, 1873. Most of his boyhood days were spent in the old Breéylinger hardware store with his father. He graduated from the Monroe high school with the class of 1891. For seven years he was a member of Co. H, Monroe national guard unit.
