

**James Sylvester Clark**  
**April 19, 1883 - November 26, 1941**

James Sylvester Clark of Belleville, Wisconsin, aged 78 years, 7 months and 7 days, passed away at his home on Wednesday, November 26, 1941.

He was born April 19, 1883 in the township of Mt. Pleasant, Green county, Wisconsin, where he lived with his parents Michael Clark and Bridget Gibbons Clark until 1871 when, with them, he moved to the Clark farm in Exeter, two miles southwest of Belleville. The next forty years he spent farming at this place and became a well-known and well-liked citizen. During period he served several years as chairman of the Exeter town board. In 1941 he retired and moved, with his sister Ella, to Belleville where he resided until his death.

He is survived by two brothers, Richard F. of Belleville and William, B. of Yakima, Washington, and one sister Ella. M. Clark of Belleville. all of whom were with him at the time of his death.

Mr. Clark was buried from St. Mary's Catholic Church of Belleville Friday morning, November 27 the Rev. Leo Zingsheim officiating at the funeral mass, Internment was in the Dayton Catholic cemetery His six nephews acted as pall bearers: Willam M. Clark of Basco; Richard C. Clark of LaCrosse; James F. Clark, Joseph Clark and Wm. B. Clark of Belleville; and Herbert Fricke of Sheboygan.
