Lloyd Clark, Former Area Resident, Dies

Lloyd Clark, 81, a retired Spring Grove township farmer and a brother of Mrs. Elva Dooley, Monticello, died at 5:30 p. m. Friday at the Monroe Manor nursing home, where he had been a patient for a short time.

He was born in Topeka, Kan., March 9, 1884, the son of William and Genevieve Button Clark. He was 28 years old when he went to Illinois and then Spring Grove township, where he had spent most of his lifetime.

On March 28, 1907, he was married in Monticello to Mary Babler, of this village. After their marriage they lived for a few years on a farm where Mr. and Mrs. M. C. Puttkamer now reside.

In addition to his sister here, he is survived by a grandson, William Clark, and two brothers, Robert, Juda, and Clayton, of Spring Grove township.

He was preceded in death by three sons, Howard, Wilbert, who was accidentally shot at the age of 13, and Harold, three months old.

Funeral services were held at 1:30 p. m. Monday in the Newcomer funeral home, Brodhead. The Rev. Melvin Nickel of the Juda EUB church, officiated, and burial was in Union Grove cemetery, Spring Grove township.
