Mrs. Lula Clark, 83, Dies Tuesday A. M.: Rites of Thursday

Mrs. Lula Clark, 83 years of age, route 1, Belleville, a highly esteemed resident of Monticello for many years, passed away at 11 a. m. Tuesday at the Wagner Nursing home, Monroe.

Mrs. Clark had been in failing health for the past two years.

Born in Milleville, Ill, Nov. 28, 1869, Lula Cox was the daughter of Joseph and Jane Hoffman Cox. When she was a small girl the family moved to Richmond, Ind., where she attended school. At the age of 16 years she came to Monticello with her brother, Clayton Cox, who operated the woolen mills here. On Oct. 23, 1888, she was united in marriage in Monticello to Charles W. Clark.

Back in the horse and buggy days she served as substitute mail carrier from the Monticello post office.

A pleasant, goodnatured person, Mrs. Clark acquired the admiration and respect of all who knew her. News of her passing was received with sincere regret by her many friends throughout this community,

Surviving are a son, Frank G. Clark, route 1, Belleville; one sister, Mrs. Robert Hough, Richmond, Ind. She was preceded in death by three brothers and four sisters, and her husband, who passed away in 1942.
