

Chester R. Crooks
Aug. 29, 1916 - July 10, 1984

Funeral services were held Saturday, July 14, for Chester R. Crooks, 67, former Monticello resident, who died on Tuesday, July 10, 1984, in Pleasant View Nursing Home, Monroe, where he had resided since Jan. 15, 1980.

Born in Lafayette County, near Blanchardville, Aug. 29, 1916, he was the son of Samuel and Matilda Kumm Crooks. He attended Blanchardville area rural schools after which he was employed as a farm hand in the area.
