Final Rites Held for Mrs. Baltz Disch, 75 Week's Illness is Fatal to Former Resident of Monticello

Funeral services for Mrs. Anna Disch, 75, resident of the Green County home, who died at 6 p.m. Tuesday after a week's illness, were held Friday at 1:30 p.m. at the Shriner-Neuschwander funeral home.

Rev. A. R. Achtemeier, pastor of the Monticello Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church, officiated and burial was in the Railroad avenue cemetery, Monticello.

Anna Zentner was born in Canton Elm, Switzerland, Dec. 4, 1866, the daughter of Casper and Barbara Zentner. She came to the United States when she was 25 years old, coming directly to Monticello, where she was married in June, 1893, to Baltz (Balthasar) Disch.

She lived in Mt. Pleasant township until moving to Monticello 21 years ago. Her husband died in 1911 and one son died when he was six years old. She was a member of the Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church, Monticello.

Survivors include one daughter, Mrs. A. Rolph, Oshkosh; two sons, Henry D. Disch, Evansville, and Casper D. Disch, Monticello; one sister, Mrs. Hilarius Zentner, Monticello; 13 grandchildren and one great-grandchild. There were several brothers and sisters surviving in Switzerland.
