Leonia Beatrice Disch Sept, 10, 1910 - Sept. 29, 1927 Funeral Rites for Leonia Disch Were Held Monday

Funeral services for Leonia Beatrice Disch, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jacob S. Disch, brief mention of whose death was made in these columns last week, were held Monday afternoon at the family home, two miles (words missing) Monticello, and at 2 o'clock at the Monticello Reformed church. Rev. A. Muehlmeier, pastor of the church conducted the service. Burial was in Highland cemetery.

The deceased was born in Pleasant township on Sept, 10, 1910. She was baptized on May 23 of the following year. Her entire life was spent at her home, with the exception of the last fifteen months, during which time she had been a patient at the Forest Lawn sanitarium, Jefferson, Wis.

She received her common school education in the neighborhood school in the vicinity of her home. Subsequently, for a period of about one year, she attended the Monticello high school.

While attending high school she was also a member of the catechetical class at the Monticello Reformed church, and was confirmed on Palm Sunday, March 28, 1926.

Because of failing health she was obliged to discontinue her school work, her condition becoming such that she was taken to Forest Lawn sanitarium on July 26, 1926. Despite the special care and attention she received at that institution, she failed to regain her former strength, and finally, after months of patient suffering, sank quietly and peacefully into her last long sleep.

The bereaved parents were twice summoned to her bedside during her last hours and were with her when she passed away. The end came on Thursday, Sept. 29, shortly after the noon hour. She had reached the age of 17 years and 19 days.

Besides the sorrowing parents, she is survived by one brother and one sister,

Miss Disch was a bright and ambitious girl and was possessed of a most friendly disposition. She was held in high esteem by all who knew her and her death removes one who will be sadly missed, not only by the bereaved relatives but by many friends and acquaintances as well.
