Casper Durtschi, Dies Sunday; Rites Held Wednesday

Funeral services for Casper Durtschi, 69 years of age, prominent Washington township farmer, who passed away suddenly at 9:30 Sunday morning following a cerebral hemorrhage, were held at 1:30 Wednesday afternoon at the Shriner-Neushwander funeral home, Monroe.
