Herman Feenje, Monticello, Dies

Native of Holland Active Churchman

Monticello— Herman W. Feenje. 60, a native of Holland and a World War I veteran, died at 2:55 p.m. yesterday at his home. He had been ill for 11 months with a malignancy.

Born in Hempens, Holland, April 15, 1889, he was the son of Wietke and Klaaska Feenje. He obtained his schooling in Holland and came to America when 24 years old, first settling at Paterson, N. J. Nov. 18, 1920, he was married here to Hilda Rolph.

Mr. Feenje was a carpenter until 1929 when he retired from that work and since then had operated an apiary.

An active church worker, Mr. Feenje long had been associated with the Evangelical United Brethren church. He was the organizer and superintendent of the Postville Memorial Sunday school, Postville, since 1938.

Surviving Mr. Feenje are his wife; his aged mother, in Holland who was 92 last Dec. 6; four brothers and two sisters in Holland. Two cousins in the States are Paul Veenje, Monticello, and Sam Veenje, state of Washington His father preceded him in death.

Funeral services will be held Monday afternoon, 1:15 in the Postville Memorial Sunday school and at 2:30 here in the Evangelical United Brethren church. Burial will be in Highland cemetery.

Rev. A. R. Felts, Freeport, formerly of the Monticello charge, will officiate at Postville services and will be assisted locally by Rev. L. A. Brown, pastor of the Monroe and Monticello Evangelical United Brethren chruches.
