Arthur W. Flesher, Area Farmer, Passes Away Early Monday

Taken ill suddenly at his farm home Sunday afternoon, Arthur W. (Pat) Flesher, 43 years of age, Washington township, passed away at 2:15 a. m. Monday in the St. Clare hospital. He entered the hospital as a medical patient.

He was born in Lafayette county June 12, 1918, the son of Charles and Rosa Schulz Flesher. He attended the Paper rural school near Darlington and the Owego rural school near Argyle.

On Jan. 16, 1940, he was united in marriage to Kathryn Legler, the ceremony taking place in St. John's church, Monroe. Mr. and Mrs. Flesher farmed in Adams township for four years, then farmed in Exeter township, and had been in Washington township for the last 11 years.

The community was plunged into sadness when it was learned that "Pat" had passed away so suddenly. Only the day before his death he visited in Monticello with several of his many friends in this community. He will be deeply missed by all who knew him.

He is survived by three sons, Gene, Monticello, and Larry and Richard, at home; one daughter, Mrs. Robert Strothman, Monroe; two brothers, Russell, Albany, and Walter J., Monticello; and two grandchildren.
