Mrs. Matt Geigel is Called at 83 Years

Mt. Pleasant Twp. Native Succumbs Following Long Illness

Monroe—Funeral services for Mrs. Matt Geigel, 83, who died on Thursday morning at her home in Monroe following an illness of several years, were held at 2 p. m. Sunday in the Shriner-Neushwander funeral home.

The Rev. Alvin C. Rabehl, pastor of the Immanuel Evangelical church, officiated, and burial was in Greenwood cemetery.

The former Euphemia Stauffacher was born Aug. 25, 1860, in Mt. Pleasant township, the daughter of Dietrich and Anna Norder Stauffacher. She was married April 6, 1882, to Matt Geigel in the Dutch Hollow church by the late Rev. Peter Held. They observed their 61st wedding anniversary last April. After their marriage, they farmed in Monroe township until 1891, when they moved to Monroe. They had lived at their present home for the past 30 years.

She was a member of the Immanuel Evangelical church and of the Missionary society.

Survivors include the husband; two sons, William N. and Albert D. Geigel, both of Monroe; two daughters, Mrs. Anna Legler and Miss Marie Geigel, both at home; five brothers, Jacob, Renwick, Ia., Leonard, Fennimore, and Nicholas, John F. and Matt H. Stauffacher, all of Monroe; a sister, Mrs. Fred Marty, Monroe; and three grandchildren, Maj. Mathew Legler, Camp Maxey, Texas, Lt. Albert W. Geigel, stationed in China with the U. S. army air forces, and John Legler, a chemist of Buffalo, N. Y. She was preceded in death by two brothers, Dietrich, Monroe, and Edward, Freeport, and three sisters, Mrs. Abe Heer, Mrs. Jacob Geigel and Mrs. Fred Kundert, all of Monroe.
