Mrs. Alma Gempeler, 68, Dies; Services Held Here Monday

Funeral services for Mrs. Alma Gempeler, 68 years of age, a former Monticello resident for many years, who died at 11 a.m. Thursday at the New Glarus Home for the Aged following a long illness, were held at 2 Monday afternoon in the Zwingli United Church of Christ here.
