Marcus B. Hoesly October 23, 1854 - July 16, 1913

Following an operation at the Globe Hospital in Freeport, Marcus B. Hoesly died there Wednesday, July 16. The deceased was born in Town Exeter, Green Co., on October 23, 1854, on the farm which he afterwards and until lately, worked himself. He was confirmed at the Swiss Reformed church at New Glarus and was in 1877 married to Catherine Voegeli, the union being blessed with two daughters and one son. The daughters are Mrs, William Elmer of New Glarus and Mrs. Fritz Rolph of Monticello, while the son, Bathasar, works the home farm, which was given into his hands when his father retired in 1907,

Last April Marcus Hoesly began to suffer from kidney trouble and went to a Madison hospital where he was treated without success. On July 3rd he left for Freeport. Surgical skill was in vain in his case and after the operation his weakened body succumbed to the grim reaper, death.

His body was brought to Monticello and under the ritual of the Reformed church interred on Friday, a large circle of friends and relatives from the whole vicinity showing the deceased the last honor.

Mr. Hoesly was considered as a farmer. possessing all the ideas of advancement and circumspection and therefore greatly respected. He was a number of times chosen as township supervisor and also on the County Board. While living in Monticello he served as a member of Village Board.
