

**Marion Elizabeth Hoesly**  
**July 13, 1902 - February 8, 1975**

Private graveside services were held Tuesday, Feb. 11, in Highland Cemetery, Monticello, for Mrs. H. C. Hoesly, 72, Madison, who died on Saturday, Feb. 8, in the New Glarus Home after a long illness. Rev. Charles G. Workman of Zwingli United Church of Christ officiated.

The former Marion Elizabeth Burgy was born July 13, 1902, a daughter of J. Jacob and Louise Tschudy Burgy. She graduated from Monticello High School in 1920, Lawrence Conservatory of Music at Appleton in 1922, and the University of Wisconsin — Madison in 1925 with degrees in music.

She taught music at Sheboygan Falls and Monroe schools, and had composed six religious vocal solos which were introduced by Jerome Hines of the Metropolitan Opera, and wrote and published four sacred choral anthems.

In the 1950's, she and her daughter, Luan, had a Sunday music program on a Madison radio station known as "Magic Keyboards". The program featured organ and piano melodies.

Mrs. Hoesly was a member of the Bashford United Methodist Church, Madison, and the Mu Phi Epsilon, honorary music sorority.

She is survived by her husband, and daughter, Mrs. Vincent (Luan) Pagligro, Racine; one brother, Fred T. Burgy, Monticello, and two grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her parents and a brother, Prof. J. Herbert Burgy, Dec. 11, 1972.
