

**Regula Hoesly**  
**March 17, 1889 - April 5, 1984**

Mrs. Regula Hoesly, 95, Madison, former resident of Monticello, died Thursday, April 5, at St. Clare Hospital, Monroe. She had been a resident of the New Glarus Home.

The daughter of Henry and Regula Zweifel Voegeli, she was born on March 17, 1889, in Mt. Pleasant Township, near Monticello.

She was married on August 14, 1915, to Baltz Hoesly in Milwaukee. They farmed in Exeter Township for five years before moving to Mt. Pleasant where they ran a dairy farm until 1941 when she moved to Monticello. She moved to Madison in 1958, where she worked for over 10 years with the Retired Senior Volunteer Program, doing services for the retired people in nursing homes. She was a resident at the New Glarus Home since August, 1983.

Her husband who preceded her in death, was a nationally known Holstein breeder and his North Star Joe Homestead bloodline is still one of the premier cattle breeds today.

Funeral services were held Monday, April 9, in Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello, where she was a member. Rev. Charles G. Workman officiated, and burial was in Highland Cemetery, Monticello.

Survivors include two daughters, Mrs. Harold (Ruth) Ulvi, Delafield, and Mrs. Jay (Gertrude) Erhlich, Madison, and seven grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.
