

**Sarah Hoesly**  
**July 3, 1883 – June 16, 1941**  
**Mrs. Fred Hoesly Dies 2 at Brooklyn**  
**Conduct Final Rites. Here For Green County Native**

Funeral services for Mrs. Fred Hoesly, 57 years of age, for many years a well known and highly esteemed resident of Brooklyn township, who passed away at 4:30 Monday afternoon in her home following an illness of an extended nature, were conducted at 2 yesterday (Wednesday) afternoon, in the Monticello Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church.

Dr. A. Muehlmeier, retired pastor of the Reformed church, officiated, and burial was in Highland cemetery.

Born in Jordan township July 3, 1883, Sarah Voegeli was a daughter of Mathias and Emma Bloom Voegeli. On Jan, 5, 1905, she was united in marriage to Fred Hoesly, the ceremony taking place in Monticello. The couple followed the vocation of farming and it was on the farm a short distance west of Brooklyn to which they moved following their marriage that Mrs. Hoesly passed away 36 years later.

The untimely death of Mrs. Hoesly brought sincere regret to a large circle of friends and acquaintances, not only in the vicinity of her home, but in the Monticello community as well.

Surviving, besides the bereaved widower, are four sons, Gilbert. Robert, Clarence and Thomas, all at home, four sisters, Mrs. W. S. Hoesly, Monticello; Mrs. George Schultz, Brooklyn; Mrs. Fred V. Stuessy and Mrs. Ed. Gmur, New Glarus; two brothers, Thomas Voegeli, Monticello, and Fred Voegeli, New Glarus; her mother, Mrs. Mathias Voegeli, and one grandchild. She was preceded in death by her father and one sister, Mrs. Henry Zentner.
