Mrs. Julien Stricken at 59

MONTICELLO (Times Special) — A Mt. Pleasant Township native, Mrs. Viola A. Julien, 59, DeKalb, died in her sleep in her home at DeKalb, Ill., and was found by her brother, Clarence W. (Slim) Freitag, about 11:30 a.m. yesterday.

DeKalb County authorities investigated and determined death was from natural causes. She is believed to have died in her sleep early Friday morning (Nov. 3). She lived alone.

The former Viola A. Freitag was born Jan. 6, 1908, a daughter of Henry F. and Euphemia Baebler Freitag. She graduated from Monticello High School and attended the University of Wisconsin for a year. She was married in 1929 in Chicago to Robert Julien. For the past 16 years she had lived at DeKalb, moving there from Villa Park, Ill.

Surviving are her mother, Mrs. Euphemia Freitag, a resident at the New Glarus Home since Oct. 1, 1967; a son, Keith Julien, Glen Ellyn, Ill.; the brother, Clarence of DeKalb, widely known as a member of Wayne King's Band, and three grandchildren. Her father, Henry Freitag, former Monroe service station owner - operator, died Feb. 24, 1967.

Services will be at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday (Nov. 8) in the Voegeli Funeral Home in Monticello. Rev. J. Allan Mittler of Zwingli United Church of Christ is to officiate. Burial will be in Highland Cemetery.

Friends may call at the funeral home from 7 to 9 p.m. tomorrow. The casket will remain closed.
