Calvin Kaderly, Area Farmer, Dies Friday; Rites Held Monday

Funeral services for Calvin Kaderly, 57 years of age, who died from a heart attack Friday afternoon while doing chores on his farm, a mile west of Montcello, were held at 1:30 Monday afternoon in St. John's United Church of Christ, Monroe.

The Rev. Paul H. Olm, church pastor, officiated, and burial was in Greenwood cemetery, Monroe. Pallbearers were Carl Schlittler, Karl Disch, Thomas Saunders, Emil Rufener, Rudolph Feller and Sam Crooks, all of Monticello.

When he failed to return to the house for supper, Mrs. Kaderly investigated, finding him in the barn. Oxygen was rushed to the scene from Monticello but revival efforts failed.

He was born May 23, 1904, on the Kaderly homestead in Jefferson township, the son of Rudolph and Afra Hefty Kaderly He attended rural school and was confirmed in St. John's church, Monroe, in 1921. He was married to Belva Jones in St. John's church Jan. 22, 1931, by the late Rev. P. A: Schuh.

The Kaderlys had been on the present farm for the past seven years, purchasing the place from Ernest Wenger, Monticello.

Surviving are the wife: a son. Russell, at home; four sisters Mrs, Sylvan Kneubuehl, Monroe. Mrs. Lillian Bitz, Winslow, Mrs Frank Malkuch, Glendive, Mont. and Mrs. Walter Douglas, Sr. Brodhead; and five brothers, Roy E. and Edwin, Monroe, Andrew. Davis, Ill., Fred, Brodhead, and Henry, Rockford.
