

## **William Fred Keehn**

**Nov. 20, 1875 - May 4, 1945**

### **W. F. Keehn Found Dead in Farm Home Esteemed Brooklyn Twp. Man Despondent Since Death of Wife**

Funeral services for William F. Keehn, 69 years of age, whose lifeless body was found Friday afternoon by his son and daughter-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Keehn, upon their return to their farm home in Brooklyn township from a business trip to Monroe, were held at 1:30 Sunday afternoon in the Keehn home and at 2 in the Peace Evangelical church, Brooklyn township.

The Rev. F. W. Huebner officiated, and burial was in the adjoining cemetery. The body was taken to the Voegeli funeral home here.

Mr. Keehn, who built a new home adjoining the farm when his son took over the management of the place, was said to have been despondent since the death of his wife, which occurred July 17, 1940, and had since resided with his son and family.

William Fred Keehn was born in Green county Nov. 20, 1875, the son of William and Minnie Wacklin Keehn. He attended rural schools in Green county and was united in marriage to Anna Rimkus June 22, 1899, the ceremony taking place in Evansville. They had always lived in Brooklyn township.

Surviving besides the son is a daughter, Mrs. Lewis Zee, Footville; three brothers, Frank, Albany, and Ed. and Gust, Evansville; one sister, Mrs. John Klitzman, Evansville; and six grandchildren. Besides his wife, he was preceded in death by one daughter in infancy, a sister, and his parents.
