Illness Fatal to Paul C. Kennett at U. Infirmary

Paul C. Kennett. 20, prominent student in the classical humanities course at the University of Wisconsin, died Monday at the student infirmary after a long illness.

He had been ill for the last two months and suffered from heart trouble.

Kennett, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. A. Kennett, 1607 Adams st., was a sophomore at the university. He was an A student, particularly interested in languages, especially in Greek.

He was born in Salt Lake City, Utah. After his graduation from Janesville high school, his parents moved to Madison two years ago. Kennett was a member of Phi Eta Sigma, honorary freshman Scholarship fraternity.

Besides his parents, survivors are three sisters, Sally, in the county normal school at Monroe; and Betty and Jeanette in West high school.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday afternoon. A brief service will be held at the home at 1 p. m., with a further service at the Methodist church in Albany at 2. p.m. Burial will be at Attica, near Albany. Officiating at the Services will be the Rev. Ormal L. Miller, University Methodist pastor, and the Rev. Richard Evans, Janesville.
