Albert Knobel, 94, well known former Monticello businessman, died Wednesday, Jan. 21, in the New Glarus Home, where he had been a resident since 1976. Death followed a brief illness.

Born in Humboldt County, Iowa, on Jan. 18, 1887, he was the son of Fred and Chloe Babler Knobel. They moved to Monticello when he was a small boy and he attended school here. He also attended the Monroe Business College.

Funeral services were held Saturday Jan, 24, in the Zwingli Church Memorial Lounge, Monticello. Rev. Charles G. Workman officiated and burial was in Highland Cemetery.
