Henry o. Krueger, 75, Dies Friday Nite After Long Illness

Funeral services for Henry O. Krueger, 75 years of age, native of Mt. Pleasant township and a farmer there for over half a century, who died Friday evening at 7:48 p. m. in the St. Clare hospital, were held at 2 Tuesday afternoon at the Zwingli United Church of Christ here.

The Rev. J. Allan Mittler, church pastor, officiated, and interment was in Highland cemetery. Pallbearers were Charles Pickett, Monroe, John H. Baebler, William Buehl, Sr., Stillman Huntley, Elmer Schwerin and Matt H. Wittenwyler.

Mr. Krueger's death culminated a long illness. He had previously submitted to surgery and re-entered the hospital on Sept. 27.

He was born in Mt. Pleasant township, on the farm where Lawrence Huntley and family now live, on Jan. 27, 1889, the son of William and Augusta Gehler Krueger. He attended the Silver rural school. On Nov. 9, 1911, he was united in marriage to Rose Blumer, the ceremony taking place at the Blumer homestead farm in Mt. Pleasant township. In December of the same year they moved to the farm where they made their home for 53 years until moving to Monticello on July 17, 1964,

Mr. Krueger was a member of the Zwingli United Church of Christ here.

He is survived by his wife: one daughter, Mrs. Edward Schmid, Monticello; one brother, William Krueger, Albany; two sisters, Mrs. Nellie Zweifel, Monticello, and Mrs. Mabel Rhyner, Albany,

Mr. Krueger was preceded in death by two sisters, Mrs. Mary Stanton, La Crosse, in 1934. and Mrs. S. R. (Emma) Holliday, Madison, Dec. 21, 1963, and a brother, Frank, in 1918.
