Fred O. Kubly, 68, Dies; Services Held Here Saturday P.M.

Funeral services for Fred O. Kubly, 68 years of age, a resident of Monticello since early last fall, who died at 7:15 on Wednesday morning of last week at the Green county hospital, Monroe, were held st 2 Saturday afternoon at the Voegeli funeral home here.
