Mrs. Herman A. Ladwig, 84, of 1512 17th avenue died at 8 last night at her home after a sudden heart attack.

Mrs. Ladwig had been in failing health the past year. Four and a half years ago she suffered a broken hip in a fall, but recovered completely. A year ago she was hospitalized with pneumonia, however, and had been ill since.

She was preceded in death by two children in infancy, two daughters, Mrs. John F. Golz in 1938 and Miss Ruby in 1940, two brothers, Frank and Fred, and two grandchildren.
