

Chester Ladwig
March 5, 1903 - March 2, 1970

A retired farmer, Chester Ladwig, 66, of 507 26th Ave., Monroe, died unexpectedly at 9:50 p.m. Monday, in St. Clare Hospital. He had entered the hospital at 9:25 that morning as a medical patient. Mr. Ladwig, a lifelong Green County resident, had a heart and diabetic condition.

He was born in Sylvester Township March 5, 1903, a son, and only child of Frank and Lydia Wobick Ladwig. He attended Speich school. On Dec. 17, 1932 he was married in St. John's United Church of Christ to Viola Marie Loeffel, with the late Rev. P. A. Schuh officiating

They farmed in Sylvester Township until retiring to Monroe in 1950 .

Mr. Ladwig was a member of St. John's Church and was president of the Dutch Hollow Cemetery Association, and its caretaker both for many years. He had served as Clerk of the Dutch Hollow school district for 10 years. Hunting and fishing were his hobbies.

Surviving are his widow, Viola; a daughter, Mrs. Charles (Lela) Lederman, Route 2, Brodhead, and three grandsons, Wayne, Dennis and Dean Lederman. His mother died April 15, 1940 and his father in November 1948.

Services will be at 1:30 p.m. Thursday, March 5, in the Stuessy Funeral Home. Rev. Milton G. Petzold of St. John's Church is to officiate. Burial will be in Dutch Hollow Cemetery.
