

**William Henry Marshall**  
**June 4, 1864 - November 7, 1928**

William Henry Marshall, oldest son of Eliza and Robert Marshall was born June 4th, 1864, near Dayton, Wis., town of Exeter, and has lived there all of his life.

He died November 7th, 1928, at the home of his only sister, Mrs. Emmet Smith, who, with four nieces, Maurine, Jean, Mildred and Leone, two nephews, Marshall Smith of Long Beach, Cal., and Charles R. Marshall of Brodhead, Wis., survive to mourn his loss. A half brother George R. Marshall of Brodhead preceded him in death ten years ago.

He was a man of sterling integrity, he was industrious, kind hearted, a grand neighbor and friend. He loved farm life and everything pertaining thereto; he preferred it to any other calling and was successful in his chosen work.

The end came very peacefully in his sleep, after about three weeks illness, of heart trouble with complications.
