April 28, 1907 – November 8, 1957

Mrs. L. G. Marty, 50, Dies Friday; Services Held Here Monday

Funeral services for Mrs. Laurance G. Marty, 50 years of age, esteemed Monticello resident, who passed away at 8:45 p. m. Friday in the St. Clare hospital, Monroe, were held at 2 Monday afternoon in the Zwingli Church. of Christ here.

The Rev. A. R. Achtemeier, church pastor, officiated, and burial was in Highland cemetery. Pallbearers were Dick Elmer, Belleville, Willis Freitag, Milwaukee, Kenneth Klassy, Monticello, LaVerne Leaderman, Brodhead, Milo Thurston, Madison, and Cloyance Zweifel, New Glarus.

Mrs. Marty's death came from the effects of a subarachnoid hemorrhage. She entered the hospital on Oct. 21 and was readmitted on Oct. 25. She was preparing to return home on Nov. 2, when she suddenly became critically ill and was rushed to surgery. Her condition remained critical until the time of her death. Mrs. Marty experienced the same serious illness in 1952, from which she recovered.

Exeter Township Native

Adelma Freitag was born in Exeter township April 28, 1907, the daughter of Dietrich and Alma Babler Freitag. She moved to the village with her parents in 1919 and graduated from the Monticello high school in 1925. On Feb. 4, 1928, she was united in marriage in Monticello to Laurance G. Marty, the ceremony being performed by the late Dr. A. Muehlmeier. Her husband, who has always been employed at the Bank of Monticello since his graduation from the University of Wisconsin, has served as cashier of the bank since 1953.

Mrs. Marty was a member of the Zwingli United Church of Christ and its Ladies' Aid Circle, and of the John Ross Women's Relief Corps.

News of Mrs. Marty's death was received with deep regret by her many friends and acquaintances throughout the community.

She is survived by her husband; her parents; one brother, Elmer, one sister, Mrs. Harvey Elmer, Monticello; four nieces, Mrs. Milo Thurston, Madison, Mrs. LaVerne Leaderman, Brodhead, and Misses Dawn and Jenny Elmer.
