He was a member of St. John the Baptist Catholic Church in Plymouth. Norm was an avid Packer and Brewer fan. He and Barb traveled all over the United States on coach trips which they truly enjoyed, and for their 50th wedding anniversary, they went on an Alaskan cruise.
