

## **Rosina Marty**

**Nov. 7, 1858 – October 1947**

### **Mrs, Rosina Marty, Aged 88, Succumbs; Rites Held Tuesday Esteemed Former Local Woman Dies Sunday in Mt. Pleasant Twp.**

Funeral services for Mrs. Rosina Marty, 88 years of age, a resident of Monticello for many years, who passed away at 11:30 o'clock Saturday night at the home of her granddaughter, Mrs. John Kernan, Mt. Pleasant township, after an illness of about a year and a half, were held at 2 Tuesday afternoon at the Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church here.

The Rev. A. R. Achtemeier, church pastor, officiated, and burial was in Highland cemetery. Pallbearers were: Herman J. Klassy, Sam P. Klassy, Clarence Kernan, Monticello, Jacob J. Marty, Orangeville, Ill, Fred J. Marty, Beloit, and Paul Wuetrich, Monroe.

Mrs. Marty, who sold her home in Monticello last spring, had been in failing health for more than a year and died as a result of a heart attack.

### **Washington Township Native**

A native of Washington township, Rosina Becker was born on Nov. 7, 1858, the daughter of Casper and Anna Blum Becker. She attended the Marty rural school, which was located near her home. In February, 1879, she was united in marriage to Jacob P. Marty. For three years, Mr. Marty made cheese, after which the couple took up farming in the vicinity of Farmer's Grove, Adams township. Mr. and Mrs. Marty moved to Monticello in 1900. Since selling her home here, Mrs. Marty had lived with members of her family. Her passing has broken a family line of five living generations.

An ambitious individual, Mrs. Marty was always busy around her home and found a great deal of pleasure in her garden and flowers.

Survivors are one son, Jost, Monroe; a granddaughter, Mrs. Kernan, Monticello; one sister, Mrs. Anna Streiff, Monticello; six grandchildren, 13 great-grandchildren, and two great-great-grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her husband in 1926, two daughters, Mrs. Anna Klassy and Mrs. Frieda Blum, in 1918, a son, Casper, in 1924, and a son in infancy.
