Fred W. Moser, 83, Area Resident, Dies: Rites Held Monday

Funeral services for Fred W. Moser, 83 years of age, Route 1, Monticello, a lifelong resident of Green county, who died at 12:30 p.m. Thursday in the St. Clare hospital, Monroe, were held at 1:30 Monday afternoon in the Zwingli United Church of Christ.

The Rev. Charles G. Workman, church pastor, officiated, and burial was in Highland cemetery. Pallbearers were Robert G. Bagley, Juda, Hobart Freitag, Ralph Freitag, New Glarus, Hollis R. Schilt, Monroe, Charles E. Hefty, Monticello, and Donald Wasrud, Iola.

Mr. Moser had undergone emergency surgery on June 28.

Mr. Moser was born March 14, 1883, in Jordan township, a son of Michael and Susan Zimmerman Moser. He attended Wallace rural school. On June 10, 1919, he was married to Lydia Freitag in the Zwingli United Church of Christ parsonage, Monticello, with the late Rev. A. Muehlmeier officiating,

The couple had since lived in Exeter township, about a mile and a half northeast of Monticello. The farm was sold in 1958 to the son, William, but the couple continued to live there and Mr. Moser remained active in farm work.

Mr. Moser was a member of the Zwingli United Church of Christ.

The couple observed their golden wedding anniversary in June of 1969 with an open house at the William Moser farm home. He is survived by the widow; a daughter, Mrs. Lyle (Marion) Sinnett, Monticello; the son, William, Exeter township; a brother, P. J. Moser, Vesper; two sisters, Mrs. Henry H. (Margaret) Freitag, New Glarus, and Mrs. Royal (Josephine) Wasrud, Iola; and six grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by a brother, John, at the age of seven; a sister, Mrs. Rudy Schilt, in 1967; his father, July 24, 1939, and his mother, March 21, 1946.
