Rites Held Saturday For Mrs. L. R. Pease, Monticello Resident

Funeral services for Mrs. Lora R. Pease, 74 years of age, resident of Monticello for many years, who passed away at 12:45 p. m. on Wednesday of last week in the St. Clare hospital, Monroe, as the result of a heart condition with which she had been afflicted for several months, were held at 1:30 Saturday afternoon at the Zwingli United Church of Christ here.

The Rev. J. Allan Mittler, church pastor, officiated, and interment was in Greenwood cemetery, Monroe. Pallbearers were John Scott, Waukesha, Jack Taylor, Slinger, John Altmann, W. D. Elmer, Wm. G. Meier and Alfred Isely.

Louise Ellen Bohalter was born April 4, 1888, on a farm near West Bend, the daughter of John and Margaret Riesch Bohalter. She was a graduate of West Bend high school and the Oshkosh State Teachers college. She taught school and on Dec. 23, 1919, was married to Lora R. Pease, the ceremony taking place in Monticello. Following their marriage Mr. and Mrs. Pease always made their home in Monticello.

For many years she assisted her husband with the operation of their hardware store here.

Mrs. Pease was a member of the Zwingli United Church of Christ, the Order of the Eastern Star, and the Women's Relief Corps.
