The good people of Attica and vicinity kindly administered to her temporal wants, for which she was indeed thankful. - Her memory will ever be cherished by her friends.

Meredith addressed a large. congregation (of which there was no kindred of the deceased present) from the 116 chapter of Psalms, verse 15: "Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his Saints," showing the difference between the Godly and the ungodly, and the importance of living a life in Christ Jesus, which was ably set forth in his sermon.
