Casper W. Rhyner, Albany, Succumbs

Funeral services for Casper William Rhyner, 75 years of age, who died in his sleep Friday morning at the Monroe Manor Nursing home, Monroe, were held at 1:30 p.m. Monday in the Sharer Funeral Home.

The Rev. Charles Fox of the First Baptist church, officiated, and burial was in Hillcrest cemetery here.

Mr. Rhyner was born in Mt. Pleasant township April 17, 1894, a son of Jacob and Sarah Freitag Rhyner. He was married June 14, 1930, in Monticello to Ada Smith.

A lifelong area resident, Mr. Rhyner was a veteran of World War I and for many years he was employed in the Farmers Co-Op, here.

He was a member of the McDermott-Steindorf American Legion post of Albany.

Surviving are four brothers, J. Henry and Wilbert, both of Albany, Alfred, Brodhead, and Lloyd, New Glarus; and two sisters, Mrs. Walter Pfeuti, rural Albany, and Mrs. Bertha Blumer, Albany.

He was preceded in death by a son, Airman Second Class Gerald Rhyner in 1953; two sisters, Mrs. Herman (Irene) Pluss and Mrs. Henry (Elizabeth) Blumer, and a brother, Jacob.
