Mrs. Jacob Rupp, Monticello, Dies

Monticello —Mrs. Jacob Rupp Sr., 68, of Monticello died yesterday at 7 p. m. in St. Clare hospital of a cerebral hemorrhage following a serious illness of three weeks. She had been an invalid the past 12 years.

The former Anna Speich was born Feb. 5, 1882, in Canton Zurich, Switzerland. She came to this country when about a year old with her parents, Christ and Elizabeth Babler Speich, who settled in the Monticello vicinity where she spent the remainder of her life. She attended Farmers Grove rural school and was married Aug. 4, 1897, at Monroe to Jacob Rupp by Rev. P. A. Schuh.

From 1910 until their retirement in 1921, the Rupps lived on the present homestead now managed by a grandson, Frederick Rupp. Mrs. Rupp was a member of Zwingli church and during her years of invalidism, maintained a creative interest in flowers and needlework.

Surviving besides the husband are one son, Jacob Jr., of Monroe; a daughter, Viola M., at home; one brother, Jacob C. Speich of Madison; a sister, Mrs. Fred W. Blum of Monticello; six grandchildren and two great-grandsons. She was preceded in death by her parents and a son, Herman, in 1909.

Services will be Wednesday at 2 in the Voegeli funeral home, Rev. A. R. Achtemeier officiating. Burial will be in Highland cemetery.
