Mrs. Schuler Stricken at 70

Mrs. Edna Schuler, 70, Monticello resident for 35 years, died unexpectedly yesterday at 4:35 p.m. in St. Clare Hospital.

She became ill Monday at her home and was admitted to the hospital on Tuesday morning.

Born in Adams Township on May 14, 1896, she was the daughter of Albert and Anna Blumer Zimmerman.

She attended the Purcell Rural School.

On Dec. 15, 1915, she was married to John C. Schuler at Monticello. They farmed in Washington Township until 1930, when her husband died. In January of 1931, she moved to the village of Monticello.

She was preceded in death by her husband and her parents.

Mrs. Schuler was a member of the Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello. She was also a member of Washington Township Circle.
