JOHN SCHULER RITES HELD AT MONTICELLO SUNDAY

Monticello.—Private funeral services for John Schuler, aged 54, who passed away here Friday were held at 1:30 Sunday afternoon at the home.

Rev. A. Muehlmeier, pastor of the Reformed church, officiated and interment took place in Monticello.

Ill health from heart trouble for more than two years is believed the cause of the self inflicted death. Mr. Schuler was found dead by his wife, who was out of doors at the time he used the revolver with deadly effect.

No coroner's inquest was held necessary.

The deceased was a life long resident of Green county. For 10 years he had resided in the village of Monticello. He was born June 6, 1871, in Washington township. On Jan. 6, 1891 he was united in marriage with Mary Moritz, also of Washington township. Mr. Schuler was a highly respected resident and was admired by a large circle of friends.

Besides the widow he is survived by two sons. They are: William, principal of the Junior high school, Monroe, and John, who resides on a farm west of Monticello. One sister, Mrs. Fred Blum, Monticello, two brothers, William Schuler Madison, Jacob Schuler, Monticello, and a half-brother, Casper Schuler of Monroe also survive. There are also five five grandchildren. Albert Schuler, a half brother, preceded him in death.
