

Marie Mabel Schultz
April 30, 1894 - Feb. 4, 1973

Mrs. Roy A. (Mabel) Schultz, 78, 1315 15th Ave., died at 8:30 p.m. Sunday, Feb. 4, in St. Clare Hospital. She had been in failing health several months and was hospitalized on Jan. 23.

The former Marie Mabel Stauffacher was born in Sylvester Township, Green County, April 30, 1894, a daughter of Nicholas and Celia Elmer Stauffacher. She attended Dutch Hollow School and due to impaired eyesight as a child attended the Janesville School for Visually Handicapped. She was married April 27, 1922, in Freeport to Roy A. Schultz. She had since lived at the same residence where her late husband had owned and operated a gun, motorcycle and bicycle shop. Mr. Schultz died Sept. 11, 1964.

Mrs. Schultz was a member of the Union Presbyterian Church and its Circle 1, the American Legion Auxiliary, World War I Barracks Auxiliary, Women of the Moose, Golden Age Club and the Monroe Garden Club. She was a trustee of the Dutch Hollow Cemetery Assn.

Surviving are a son, LeRoy, Monroe, and three grandchildren, Jerry, Racine; Judy, a senior at the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire, and John, at home.

A brother, William Stauffacher, Browntown, preceded her in death.

Services for Mrs. Schultz will be at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday, Feb. 7, in Shriner-Neushwander Funeral Home. Rev. M. J. Roehrdanz of the United Methodist Church is to officiate, in the absence of a Union Presbyterian minister. Burial will be in the Dutch Hollow Cemetery.

Visitation for Mrs. Schultz will be after 4 p.m. Tuesday.

A memorial fund has been established for the Union Presbyterian Church.
