Roy A. Schultz, 70, Monroe Gunsmith, Succumbs Friday

Funeral services for Roy A. Schultz, 70, veteran Monroe business man, who died Friday in the Veterans hospital, Madison, were held at 2 P. m. Sunday in the Shriner-Neushwander funeral home, Monroe.

Rev. Gerritt E. Mouw, pastor of Union Presbyterian church, officiated, and burial was in the Dutch Hollow cemetery, a few miles southeast of Monticello.

Mr. Schultz had been in failing health for several years.

He was born at Schultz. Station, four miles south of Monticello, on April 4, 1894, the son of Fred and Mary Gill Schultz, who operated a depot general store. He attended the Simmons rural school. On April 27, 1922, he was married in Freeport to the former Mable Stauffacher. They have always lived in Monroe.

Mr. Schultz, a well known gunsmith, operated a gun, motorcycle and bicycle shop in Monroe for 40 years,

He was a member of the American Legion and served a year in France during World War I.

Surviving are his wife; a son, Leroy Schultz, Kimberly; a sister, Mrs. Albert Witt, Route 1, Monticello; a brother, Harry, Boise, Idaho; and three grandchildren, Jerry, Judy and John Schultz,

He was preceded in death by his parents and a sister, Mrs. Emil V. Stauffacher , Monroe.
