## Mrs. Siegenthaler Rites Held Tuesday

Funeral services for Mrs. Gottlieb Siegenthaler, 75 years of age, Monticello, who passed. away Saturday evening at the Masshardt Nursing home, Monroe, where she had been the past six and one-half years, were held at 2 Tuesday afternoon at the Voegeli funeral home here.
