Jacob Stauffer, 76, Retired Area Farmer, Succumbs Thursday

Funeral services for Jacob B. Stauffer, 76 years of age, a retired Mt. Pleasant township farmer, who died at 8 pm. Thursday at the St. Clare hospital, Monroe, where he had been a medical patient since Monday, were held at 1:30 Monday afternoon in Zwingli United Church of Christ here.

The Rev. J. Allan Mittler, officiated, and burial was in Highland cemetery. Pallbearers were Fred A. Karlen, Wilbert E. Stauffer, Fred LaRosh, Jacob Voegeli, John Stenbrotten and Jacob Wittenwyler.

Mr. Stauffer was born Aug. 28, 1890, in Mt. Pleasant township, a son of Jacob and Katherine ZumBrunnen Stauffer. He attended Mission House college for two years, 1906-08. On Feb. 12, 1918, he was united in marriage to Johanna Ingoid. The couple farmed a mile and a half south of Monticello until retiring to the village in 1949.

Mr. Stauffer was a devoted member and past president of the Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello.

Among his survivors are the widow; two sons, John J., on the home farm, and Robert M., Rt. 3, Monroe; two daughters, Mrs. Edward (Kathryn) Becker, Monroe, and Mrs. William (Marion) Borchart, Menasha; three sisters, Mrs. Anna Gempeler, Footville, and Misses Kate and Rose Stauffer, both of Monticello, and 10 grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents; three sisters, Miss Emilie Stauffer and Mrs. Clifton Taylor of California, and Mrs. Ernest Gempeler, Monticello; and two brothers, Fred Stauffer and C. M. Stauffer, both of Monticello.
