Rites Held Sunday For Mrs. Steussy

Final Services Conducted At Voegeli Funeral Home Here

Funeral services for Mrs. Henry M. Steussy, aged 54, highly esteemed Milwaukee resident and a native of Monticello, who passed away at about 10 o'clock on Wednesday morning of last week at the Lakeview hospital in that city, after a critical illness since last April, were conducted at 1:30 Sunday afternoon in the Voegeli funeral home here.

Mr. Alfred L. Smith, Milwaukee, officiated, and burial was in the Swiss Evangelical and Reformed church cemetery, New Glarus.

She was the wife of Henry M. Steussy, prominent Milwaukee executive.

Mrs. Steussy was born in Monticello, the eldest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Otto H. Babler. She was educated in the Monticello schools and was united in marriage to Mr. Steussy in 1915. Shortly after their marriage, they moved to Milwaukee, where they had since resided.

Mrs. Steussy was active in many social and charitable organizations. She had taken an active part in the women's activities of the Ozaukee Country club, where her husband was president for many years, and very active with the Red Cross unit, and the women's social activities of the Milwaukee Athletic club. Her chief interests outside of this work were in traveling and the recreational facilities offered by the out-of-doors.

Surviving are the husband; one son, Norman, aged 30, who lives in Olympia, Wash., and her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Otto H. Babler, Monticello. Her son was discharged from the quartermaster corps a number of months ago, in which he served for a few months less than five years, during which time he spent 28 months in Europe.

She was preceded in death by a sister, Hilda, who passed away in August, 1917.
