John L. Streiff March 6, 1916 - June 29, 1984

A former Monticello businessman, John L. Streiff, 68, died on Friday, June 29, 1984, at the New Glarus Home following an extended illness.

Services were held Monday, July 2 at the Zwingli United Church of Christ with the Rev. Charles G. Workman officiating. Burial was in Highland Cemetery.

He was preceded in death by his parents, and one sister, Mrs. Esther Stauffacher in 1945.
