Feb. 5, 1871 - March 19, 1942
Attica Resident Died Last Week

Funeral services for Mrs. Ralph Swann, who died Thursday evening, were held Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Attica Methodist church. Rev. S. H. Austin officiated assisted by Rev. W. C. Snow of South Wayne, former pastor at Attica. Burial was in the Attica cemetery.

During the services Frank Ten Eyck sang "Sometime We'll Understand" and "Ivory Palaces."

Pallbearers were Romaine Bartlett, Arthur Swann, Verne Jones, Newton Davis, Edward Davis, and Dempster Davis.

Mrs. Swann's death followed a lingering illness of many years. She had been confined to her bed for the past month. Death occurred on Thursday, March 19, at 5:30 o'clock. She was 71 years old.

A lifelong resident of Attica, Mrs. Swann, the former Myrta Bartlett, daughter of Joseph and Eliza Pryce Bartlett, was born February 5, 1871. Her marriage to Ralph Swann, took place May 23 1889 at Madison, She was a member of the Attica Methodist church for over fifty years.

Survives are the widower, a daughter, Mrs. Ysabell Jipson of Chokio, Minn. two sons, Marion Swann of Attica and Steven Swann of Oregon a sister, Miss Gertrude Bartlett of Attica, seven grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren. One son, Archie, died in infancy. She was preceded in death by five sisters and two brothers.
