

Mildred M. Taylor
March 29, 1904 - Oct. 16, 1984

Mrs. Mildred M. Taylor, 80, Monticello, died Tuesday, Oct. 16, 1984, at Pleasant View Nursing Home, Monroe, where she had resided the past 2 1/2 years.

Born on March 29, 1904, she was the daughter of Clarence H. and Emma Edwards Gould. She attended Belleville High School and on June 1, 1922, she was married to Duane Lewis in Dubuque, Iowa. She was later married to Forest Taylor in August of 1934.
