John Huldreich Theiler

Jan. 13, 1864 - 1917

John H. Theiler, familiarly known as "Huldy" by a large circle of friends throughout Green county, passed away at his home at Monroe, Tuesday night at 11:30 o'clock, after an illness of six months. His death was due to heart trouble and other complications.

The deceased was born at Faulensee, Gemeinde Spiez, Berne, Switzerland on Jan. 13, 1864. He came to this country with his parents in 1867, coming direct to Green county. Shortly afterward they purchased the large farm in Washington township, now occupied by Fred Thomann.

John H. Theiler and Miss Rosina Blumer, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Adam Blumer, were united in marriage Jan. 27th 1887 and for several years resided on the Christ Theiler homestead farm. In 1891 they moved to the Adam Blumer farm where they resided for seventeen years. To the union were born four daughters and three sons, all of which, with his widow, survive him.

Ten years ago the family moved to Monroe. For a number of years he was engaged in the butcher business, and later in the real estate business. He was widely acquainted and probably one of the best known persons in Green county. He was the organizer of the Sharpshooter's society at Monroe.

The funeral services are held at Monroe today, from the St. John's Evangelical church, Rev. P. A. Schuh officiating, and interment will be made in Greenwood cemetery. Quite a number from here are attending the funeral.
